



Support program for the organization a Strategic Workshop

Created in April 2012 by the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Santé (FRQS), the mission of the **Cardiometabolic Health, Diabetes and Obesity Research Network** is to pursue the development of research in metabolic and cardiovascular health, diabetes and obesity, to transmit knowledge and to mobilize knowledge to promote sustainable health among Quebecers.

The network launches its program to support the organization of a strategic workshop for the year 2024 - 2025. This program aims to structure research, collaboration and concertation activities by bringing together all the stakeholders in a given CMDO theme at the same table, and then providing one-off support for the launch of a intercenter research project that will implement one or more of the workshop's recommendations. Consequently, any researcher who is a regular member of the CMDO can apply for financial support through this program for the organization of a strategic workshop related to one of the CMDO Network's three themes (cardiometabolic health, diabetes and/or obesity). The overall objective of this combined workshop/intercenter project program is to consolidate efforts to mobilize knowledge and fill a need on issues and challenges to catalyze, among other things, intervention research with different populations and sub-populations by leveraging the expertise of the CMDO axes (existing and emerging) and creating partnerships with the public health network, municipalities, schools, etc. Only one workshop will be funded per year. Eligibility criteria and evaluation procedures are described below. The selected workshop will receive \$30,000 in funding. In addition, a maximum of \$40,000 has been set aside to fund an inter-center project that will emerge directly from this workshop.

2025 The deadline for submission of proposals is <u>September 26, 2024</u>, for a workshop to be held before February 28, 2025.

The emerging intercenter project must be submitted to the CMDO by March 31, 2025.

Women, aboriginal people, visible minorities, ethnic minorities, people with disabilities and people from the 2SLGBTQIA+ community are encouraged to submit their workshop proposals. For the purposes of evaluation, we take care to recruit a diverse committee reflecting the profiles of the candidates, and we ensure an evaluation process that takes into account the particular situations of the candidates, including atypical trajectories.

Applications submitted late, incomplete or that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be evaluated. The workshop that has been awarded a grant must be initiated within the time period specified in the application.

Eligibility:

1. The person responsible for applying for financial support must be a researcher who is a regular member of the CMDO Network. This person will be responsible for the overall organization of the workshop :





- The person in charge <u>may not apply</u> as principal investigator to the *Intercentre Structuring Initiatives* competition (December) in the same year that he or she submits an application to the *Strategic Workshops* competition (September).;
- 2. The Workshop Organizing Committee must include all stakeholders in order to set up the workshop and ensure the realization of the intercenter project that will emerge from it. This includes, for example :
 - > The researcher (regular member of the CMDO) in charge of the worksho ;
 - Stakeholders taking part in discussions during the workshop and project implementation (people from the ministerial/governmental sector, patientpartners, citizens, researchers, research students, members of industry or the community sector, etc.).;
 - A workshop management assistant ;
- 3. The event must be attended by <u>at least 10 people</u> (*not including organizers, presenters and research team staff*). The exact final number of participants should be communicated to the network after the workshop.
- 4. The activity must take place in province of Quebec.
- 5. The activity must meet a pressing need in Quebec society in the CMDO Network's areas of interest (cardiometabolic health, diabetes and/or obesity). Workshops aimed at improving the sustainable health of the Quebec population (disease prevention or management, improved access and care trajectories, new technologies, data collection and knowledge mobilization, etc.) will be given priority. Proposals with a low probability of achieving significant results and long-term impact are unlikely to receive funding.
- 6. The activity should include an outline of an intercenter project that can be proposed during the workshop, in order to support and direct the discussions, enhance their impact and enable a detailed project to be submitted to the CMDO within a month of the workshop. The project submitted later to the CMDO may be an improved version of the project discussed during the workshop.
- 7. At the workshop, participants must be informed that the CMDO Network is funding the activity and of the possibility of becoming a Network Partner in order to connect with Quebec research in CMDO fields and participate in the evaluation of research priorities.
- 8. Amount granted:
 - ➤ A grant of \$30,000 to organize the workshop:
 - An allocation of \$40,000 has been set aside to fund an intercenter research project that will emerge directly from the workshop;
 - This funding <u>IS NOT GUARANTEED</u> and must be submitted to the CMDO Evaluation Committee;
 - See project proposal evaluation below;



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Terms and conditions for network activity support:

The request for financial support must be submitted by a researcher who is a regular member of the CMDO Network and who is responsible for organizing the workshop, by filling in the electronic form on the network's website (online, see below):

- 1) Identification of the person responsible for the request;
- 2) Workshop name, location and dates;
- 3) Identify the workshop stakeholders (name and function of each participant) who will be part of the organizing committee;
- 4) Identify workshop guest speakers (name and function of each speaker);
- 5) Identify an assistant who will manage the organization of the workshop (name and function of this person);
- 6) <u>Workshop description (Proposal)</u>: Provide a detailed description of the workshop including scientific rationale, objectives and hypotheses, methodology and potential spin-offs;
- 7) Approximate number of workshop participants from various sectors (government/citizens/patients/partners/research team members, etc.);
- 8) <u>Intercenter project description (General idea)</u>: Provide a general description of the intercenter project including scientific rationale, objectives and hypotheses, methodology and potential spin-offs. Please also include a paragraph outlining the originality of your project (potential to create new knowledge, originality of hypotheses and research questions, novelty of approach, new methodologies or new application of existing methodologies);
- 9) Detailed description of the budget to organize the workshop (Use of the \$30,000);
- 10) A justification of why the CMDO Network should support the event in light of its mission and objectives.

Proposal evaluation:

Proposals will be evaluated by the network's Executive Committee and Scientific Steering Committee according to the above criteria. The results will be communicated to the selected candidates in the weeks following the competition application date. The intercenter project will also be evaluated by the network's Executive Committee and Scientific Steering Committee, but according to the criteria of the *Intercenter Structuring Initiatives* competition - <u>Click HERE</u>.

Terms of delivery and administration:

The amounts granted may be used for any legitimate expenses according to FRQS standards for the organization of the activity, in particular :

- room rental;
- audiovisual service;
- caterer;
- participants' travel expenses;
- salary and benefits of event coordinator;
- Please note that alcoholic beverages are not eligible under FRQS standards.
